Activity: Bathing Location: Bedroom

Number of people required: Two

Risk to our son: Medium Risk to handler: Medium

Equipment needed: Hoist, changing bench, bath seat, kneeling pad, tegaderm, bell, pipe lagging,

and thermometer. Ensure all clothes, soap, towels, pad etc are ready

Skill required: At least one member of staff must have been trained and be proficient in carrying

out the task

Considerations: Health of handlers on the day, time available, our son' health/mood on the day, This can impact on his tone and control of movements. Test bell and check that second person is going to be available for the whole task. Getting cold is not desirable for our son therefore bathroom needs to be warm. He is **NOT** to be left alone in room while on bench/in bath **EVER**.

Alternatives: Ask our son if he would like a shower/strip wash, complete on another day.
